After a year at the University of Connecticut, David went to DePauw University in 1989 and has been there ever since. David teaches courses in Contemporary Society, Deviance, Mental Illness, Family, Social Psychology, and Research Methods. He has published numerous articles on teaching and has presented research papers on the intersection of gender and power in intimate relationships. Recently most of his scholarly activity has been devoted to writing and revising several books, including **Sociology: Exploring the Architecture of Everyday Life** (SAGE, 2014); *Identities and Inequalities: Exploring the Intersections of Race, Class, Gender, and Sexuality* (McGraw-Hill, 2012); and *Families: A Sociological Perspective* (McGraw-Hill, 2009). He is currently working on a booklength manuscript that examines the cultural meaning, institutional importance, and social limitations of "second chance" narratives in everyday life.
